Programme Overview

The MSc in Emergency Medicine is an established and successful programme which provides flexible, on line education in the speciality. The 'assessment only' route complements the study that you are undertaking as a trainee in emergency medicine in the North West deanery and allows you to add academic credits to the unit you are undertaking, leading to a postgraduate certificate or diploma in Emergency Medicine or further, with the completion of a practice focused project which contains some of the components of your accreditation, to a Masters degree in Emergency Medicine.



Turning experience into Academic Credit

Academic credit is gained by adding on an academic assessment component to the units you are already studying. Assessment modes are varied but include reflective, evidence based case studies, short answer questions and academic essays.

A flexible, modular professional programme

We recognise the realities of combining study with work and life outside work and with this in mind, you can decide at what speed to accumulate academic credits, adding academic assessment to your choice of units, at the rate which works best for you. The core requirements for any award are two clinical and one research units and the rest are entirely up to you.

Fees

A 20 credit unit costs £244 (as opposed to £785 for a taught unit) and is a cost effective way of gaining a Masters level qualification alongside your existing study.
